#### **Character Strength Lessons**

This week, our classes have been learning about the character strengths of Hope and Perseverance.

Mrs Cox has created the beginnings of a Hope Tree in our playground. The idea is that the tree will become a symbolic place where individuals or class groups can go to think about the good things to come.eg. I hope we have fun on our school excursion. I hope my best friend feels better soon and returns to school. I hope we can attract more wildlife to our school.

The 'HOPE TREE' will be decorated with colour. Students are encouraged to knit, crotchet, french knit, finger knit or weave, to make a square or rectangle and drop it off to 3C's classroom, to decorate the tree.
