This term, we have a record number of students who have received a Mari Badge, so we will be hosting a K -2 Pizza Lunch and a 3-6 Pizza Lunch, to cater for the amount of students. The K-2 (Infants) lunch will be on Tuesday, 8th December, and the 3-6 (Primary) lunch will be on Wednesday, 9th December. Invitations will be sent out to the deserving students early next week.

PAT Assessment Results

This year, our school opted in to a Progressive Achievement Testing (PAT) method, to gather student results, to better inform our teaching in 2020. The approach focuses on assessing and monitoring student growth over time and is underpinned by an understanding that students of the same age and in the same year of school can be at very different points in their learning and development.

The students undertook the Reading and Numeracy assessments in Years 3 to 6, in Term 1 and then again in Term 4. I would just like to share with you some of our outstanding results, with many students achieving their expected growth or beyond from one test to the other.

Years 3 to 6 Reading Term 1 Students in top 3 bands – 11% Students in middle 3 bands – 61% Students in bottom 3 bands – 28% Term 4 Students in top 3 bands – 20% Students in middle 3 bands – 65%

Students in bottom 3 bands – 05% Years 3 to 6 Numeracy

Term 1

Students in top 3 bands – 2% Students in middle 3 bands – 67% Students in bottom 3 bands – 31%

Term 4

Students in top 3 bands – 5% Students in middle 3 bands – 79% Students in bottom 3 bands – 14%

I am proud of how hard our students have worked, and how explicitly our teachers have taught their students, considering the year we have had.

PBL Bingo and PBL Rewards Day

Our Term 4 PBL Rewards Day will be held on Friday, 11th December. The PBL Bingo will be at 10:50am, and our students who have displayed excellent behaviour throughout the term will get to participate in fun PBL activities in their Stage cohorts. This is always a nice way to reward our students, and as I heard in one of the leadership speeches, I think the students would like more of them!

The Year 6 farewell will be held on Friday, 11th December and will be limited to Year 5 and 6 students only, as well as supervising staff. Students will have a picnic-style dinner prepared by our canteen, a silent disco (yay!) and a celebratory cake (individual cupcakes in stack!). Year 6 students will then camp overnight in the school (hall and library), with a movie to be screened after the Year 5 students retire home for the night. A BBQ breakfast will follow the next morning, after which students will be collected by parents.
