Year 2 Swimming School

Our annual Year 2 Swim School begins on Monday, 9th March. School photos will be organised for Year 2 on this day, so as not to clash with the swimming school. Class times for visiting the pool are as follows: 2H and 2L - 12:25-1:50pm, 2A and 1/2W - 1:30-2:15pm. Children who are not attending swimming school in Year 2 will be sent to other classes with classroom work during the time their teacher is at the swimming school. Students in Year 1 in 1/2W will integrate into the other Year 1 classes to continue their learning progression.

Homework procedures

Starting this term, as a result of staff, student and parent feedback, there will be no weekly set homework tasks for classes, other than the regular home reading program that we offer in Kindergarten to Year 4 and in Years 5 and 6, there will be a strong reading encouragement focus, with resources students can take home to support their independent reading. All year 1 - Year 6 classes will now be linked into an online maths program called Prodigy. Your child should have received a username and password to be able to access Prodigy on a computer or mobile device from home. Please contact your child's classroom teacher if this has not been the case yet.

Child Safety Handbook email and link

Date and Oat Bliss Balls

INGREDIENTS

1 cup rolled oats

500g packer of pitted dates

1 cup dedicated coconut

2 TBLS maple syrup

2 TBLS cocoa

Extra coconut to roll the bliss balls in

METHOD

Soak the dates in warm water until they become soft. Drain the dates and place all the ingredients into a food processor and blitz until well combined.

Roll into balls and coat in the extra coconut.

This is our school PBL mascot, Mari.



Mari was chosen after a school-wide voting process in 2016. The name Mari came from the Indigenous word meaning kangaroo.



Mari Awards

Each day a Mari Award is given out to one student in each class who has shown **Respect, Responsibility and Excellence.**This is taken home by the student to show their family members. Students collect these Mari Awards and can see the principal (Mr Graham) when they have 3, 6, 9, 12 and 15 Mari Awards. Below is a table outlining the Mari Award System.

Mari Class for Assembly

Each fortnight a class is awarded the 'Mari Class' based on their excellent behaviour in assembly. During assembly the teachers are looking for the best class.

The winning class receives Mari for 4 weeks. These photos can be seen as part of the powerpoint at the following assembly.

Classroom Tickets

Students can receive PBL tickets in the playground and classroom if they are displaying our school's values of:

Respect, Responsibility and Excellence

Students write their name and class on the ticket and place it in their designated mailbox. There is a draw each Monday where students' tickets are drawn out and they choose a prize from the PBL prize box.

Assembly Awards

As a part of our awards at assembly, students can receive a PBL 'Star Award'. This is given to one person from each class to acknowledge a student who has displayed the school's values.

PBL Bingo

Throughout the year the school plays a whole-school game of PBL Bingo. Each class has a bingo card and listens to the school values being called out over the intercom system. This is a great way for students to increase their knowledge of our school values

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PBL Rewards Day

Towards the end of each term, the school has a PBL Rewards Day. This is for students who have consistently displayed our school values all term.



Golden Ticket

The Golden Ticket Program is a lunch time program helping recognise students who consistently get it right. Students participate in a variety of games including minute to win it, human hungry hippos and high interest games.

PBL Lessons

Each week there is a PBL focus where students learn more about one of our expectations. Students participate in PBL lessons each week where they learn more about the weekly focus from our values.

Here, students role play examples of how to be Respectful, Responsible and Excellent students at S.H.P.S.

PBL Signs

Around the school you will notice our PBL signs that display our school's values and expectations. These are a great tool to use with students and allow them to reflect on their behaviour.
