Principal's Report

Year 2 Swimming School

Staff Professional Learning

Our Deputy and Assistant Principals recently attending professional learning called Foundations of Teaching Sprints, delivered by Simon Breakspear. This professional learning supports the work that our Deputy and Assistant Principals will be doing to build the capacity of our teachers to focus in on making positive shifts in our student learning and outcome achievement. The Teaching Sprints will involve the shared planning of a very explicit focus area (guided reading, for example) in which teachers make small shifts in their practice, to make a difference to the student learning. These shifts or changes are then brought back to the group for evaluation, and then the process starts again. Exciting stuff!
