#### SCHOOL EXCURSION School Excursions

#### Digital Devices Policy – Moochie watches

Earlier this year, the NSW Department of Education published a Digital Device and Online Services Policy. To support this policy, our school produced Safe, Respectful Behaviour procedures for the use of Digital Devices and online services. These procedures were sent to families at the beginning of the year. Digital Devices are:

• electronic devices that can receive, store, process and share digital information and connect to applications (apps), websites and other online services. They include desktop computers, laptops, tablets, smartwatches, smartphones and other devices.

**Moochie watches** fall into the category of a digital device, and as such, students are to do the following with them, if they need to bring them to school:

• Make sure that any devices you bring to school are left in the front office upon arrival, with a name tag attached.

#### School Uniform

Please ensure your child has a school jumper or jacket to wear every morning to school, as we move into the winter months. Wearing an out of uniform shirt underneath the school shirt is not appropriate. This is particularly relevant in our Stage 3 classes. Students who are coming to school with jumpers that are not part of our school uniform, will be asked to remove it and they will be supplied with a school jumper for the day. Please contact the school, via note or phone call, to discuss this, if your child is unable to wear a school uniform jumper or jacket.

#### Parking Procedures

Please ensure you are parking correctly outside our school grounds of a morning and afternoon. There is clear signage with the correct procedures. Parking inspectors are randomly patrolling this area.
