Principal's Report

We are finally starting to see a little bit of action, in terms of the easing of restrictions for our students and families. As of this week, the NSW Department of Education has allowed the following:

• School Assemblies can run for 15 minutes

Term 2

- Choir can start again, as well as other performing arts groups band, dance and drama are now up and running
- Playgroup to start up again (see below)

Our school has decided to wait until Term 3 to start our award assemblies again, as 15 minutes is not enough time to get through our assemblies. We will likely run our first few assemblies without parents attending, and then monitoring the easing of restrictions early in Term 3. More information about when these assemblies will be held, will follow in future newsletters.

Most other restrictions will be eased in Term 3. The following list is what our school will continue to have in place, or indeed update, if necessary:

- We will continue to have pick up and drop off outside the school gates for the first two weeks, at least, while we continue to monitor social distancing obligations.
- Students will be able to participate in sporting activities and games at lunch and recess.
- Inter-school student events are able to now go ahead debating, public speaking, performing arts etc.
- P&C Meetings are able to take place as long as strong social distancing guidelines are followed. Our first meeting in Term 3 will be in Week 5. Further information will be published closer to the date.
- Parent/Teacher meetings are only to take place where absolutely necessary. We will need to delay our 3 way conferencing until mid-Term 3.
- Professional Learning most staff professional learning will take place online for the majority of Term 3.
- Major Excursions a decision about going ahead with these excursions will be made at the end of Week 2 next term.



Vice-Captaincy change

Due to unforeseen circumstances, one of our school vice captains has had to relinquish his position on the student executive team. Tipi P has handed over the vice captaincy leadership to Kaiden B. Kaiden gave his pledge speech to the Principal, alongside his fellow leaders, yesterday. So Kaiden will now take on the role of the boy vice-captain at our school. Well done Kaiden, and thank you to Tipi for his leadership at the beginning of the year.
