Principal's Report

I would like to commend our office staff, who coordinated parents with paper copies on a daily and weekly basis, and also talked through the many trials and tribulations of trying to get your child to work from home. What a great school community!

I am so glad we are back to face to face learning, and I am so impressed that we have so many students back at school straight away under our Level 3 guidelines.



I will try and explain our current guidelines, which are quite different to those in other parts of the state, which is why you may read or hear conflicting information about schools opening and closing etc.

<u>Masks</u>

Term 4

Masks or face coverings are currently required in:

- all indoor and outdoor settings for all staff
- all indoor and outdoor settings for students in Year 7 and above.

<u>Visitors</u>

No parents or other non-essential visitors will be allowed on site.

Allied Health partners and other providers are permitted and should continue to operate in a COVID-safe way.

- Events, assemblies, excursions, field trips etc are not allowed

- Singing, dancing, choir, band and sport (except within PDHPE classes) are not permitted. Non-essential visitors are not permitted on school sites.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Parents and carers must follow their school's advice regarding changes to student drop off and pick up. This includes staying in the car when dropping off and picking up children if it is safe to do so. **Please ensure that you are not crowding around the entrances to gates of an afternoon.** Please communicate with your child about a place to meet in the afternoon. Being consistent with where you stand and wait will really help them know where you are. You are welcome to spread out across the pathway on Dorsman Drive and Blaxland Avenue. We will ensure that no child will be left waiting at the gate for too long.

Students Arriving and Leaving

K-2 students will be able to enter every school gate.

3-6 students will not be able to enter or exit Falkiner Crescent gate.

K-2 students will finish at 3pm, to avoid congestion at the exits. Siblings may wait at school for their brothers or sisters, in 3-6, who will finish at 3:10pm. Buses will run as normal.

We will recommence Waraya Young Mob Centre from next week. Please be aware that the Education Centre will operate on a Monday, with the first session commencing on MONDAY 11th October 2021 in K6K classroom, for Years 3 to 6 students who were previously attending in Term 3. If you would like your child to participate in this great service, please contact the office for a permission note.

The centre will be under the tutorship of Jo Tonon, and we also have a group of dedicated teachers who are volunteering their time as well.

Children will participate in reading, mathematics and cultural activities. Our primary aim is to cater for the individual academic needs of the students.

Children will be provided with a healthy afternoon snack.

Sessions conclude at 4.30pm.

It is your responsibility to arrange how your child will return home at 4.30pm. The children will be walked to the Dorsman Drive Gate at 4:30 pm.

Playground Equipment upgrade

Our front playground equipment is being upgraded and construction begins next Friday, 15th October, with temporary fencing being installed on the Thursday. They will work through the weekend and then into Week 3. They will also be installing rubber under the play equipment on the back oval, which will likely occur in Week 4. This equipment will need to be closed until the work is complete.

Voluntary School Contributions

Statement of accounts will be sent home this week, with the voluntary school contribution (VSC) being the only current payment to be allocated to families. The VSC is \$50 per child, or \$75 for a family of two or more children. Preferred payment is online, on the school website, through the MAKE A PAYMENT link at the top of the page.
