Principal's Report

Remembrance Day Ceremony

Thank you to the staff and students who were able to pull off our virtual Remembrance Day ceremony on Thursday, 11th November. Mrs Daubeney put together a video of the commemoration ceremony that each class was able to view, and some of our defence student leaders were able to conduct the ceremony through the class intercom system to read various texts related to this very special day.









Level 3 Restrictions

Just a reminder that are restrictions have eased slightly, as every other school in the state aligns to Level 3 restrictions.

- Students, staff and visitors must not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms.
- All staff and adult visitors on the school site must be fully vaccinated and provide proof of vaccination.
- Masks are required indoors for all staff, adult visitors and strongly recommended indoors for primary students. Masks
 can be removed when eating or exercising.
- We are able to host P&C meetings again, with a COVID plan.
- Kindergarten orientation this week will be without parents (drop off and pick up is still okay), unless individualised support is required for a child. This will have to be communicated in advance to our school executive team.

Kindergarten Orientation

I am really sorry that we had to postpone the first of our three Kindergarten Orientation sessions yesterday. Obviously this was very disappointing for the children and families, and to be informed at such short notice was unavoidable, however we are not able to predict when staff will be extremely ill. We want the very best start for our 2022 Kinder students, and with a staff shortage such as we had yesterday, we would not have been able to provide that great start.



Our new Orientation sessions will now be held on Thursday, 18th November, 25th November and 2nd December. Just a reminder that there are three sessions each of the days, and your child has been placed into one of those sessions, indicated by a note that was sent home last week. A few reminders:

Due to COVID guidelines that the school must adhere to, we ask for your cooperation in doing the following:

- Prior to attending the orientation session, ensure that the school has received your child's enrolment
- Please stay home if you or your child has any cold or flu-like symptoms
- Please wear a mask on school grounds and adhere to social distancing requirements
- Please do not stay for drop off or pick up for longer than 10 minutes
- Enter the school via Dorsman Drive. If you are only dropping off and picking up, you do not need to use the QR Code.

It is not necessary for your child to bring along anything on the day, just a big smile! We look forward to our families attending for the rest of the term.

Online Concerns

TikTok is a social media app for creating and sharing short videos, you can create and share short lip-sync, comedy and talent videos of 3 to 15 seconds. You can also create short looping videos up to 60 seconds long. It is really vital that, if you haven chosen to allow your child to have a TikTok account, you are aware of what is being uploaded and viewed on that account. Some of the stories that are coming from our Stage 3 students are alarming, in terms of what they are viewing and uploading. School Banking

On 24 October 2021, the Treasurer and the Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning announced that the school banking programs will no longer be run in New South Wales schools from 2022.

School banking programs at Singleton Heights Public School are arranged at a local level [via the school's P&C Association]. With the upcoming cessation of the program, students will no longer be able to deposit savings through the school banking program at Singleton Heights Public School]. You can still keep your child's bank account open and can continue to make deposits into your child's accounts through online transfer or at any bank branch. More information is available on the department's school banking website and Commonwealth Bank of Australia's school banking website.



The decision was made following the review of the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) review on School Banking Programs on 15 December 2020, which found that the costs of the program outweighed the benefits.
