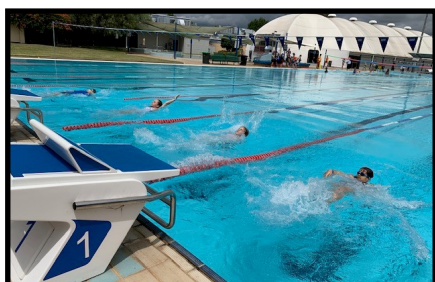

Attendance Expectations

Congratulations to 5L and 2A, who received the School Attendance trophy and the right to share Mari throughout the week, for having 0 absences last week.

As a part of our new school improvement planning process, we will have a strong focus on Attendance, and we have clear accountable improvement measures to focus on. In 2021, these improvement measures are that we, as a school community, will focus on having 71% of our students attending school 90% or more of the time. So that is 360 of our 505 students coming to school for 9 out of every 10 days each fortnight. Surely that is an easily obtainable goal. Have a look at the statistics below:

Voluntary School Contributions

COVID GUIDELINES

Despite the fact that our guidelines have stated that parents of K-2 students are able to enter the school, can we all please be mindful of the time you arrive at school, both for drop off and pick up. Drop off means to just drop your child and leave the school grounds, and pick up needs to be as close to the bell as possible. This will potentially alleviate the issues with social distancing, and avoid parents having to scan the QR Code each time you enter the school. We really don't want to go back to keeping parents outside the gates, but if the crowds are not able to distance from each other, we may need to revert back to our model from last year. Thank you for your support with this. Kindergarten parents may be able to wait out in the Kinder COLA area, where the painted animals are on the concrete, for the 3:10pm pick next week and beyond.

Executive Teacher Roles in 2021

Our 4 Assistant Principals are going to be working hard on focusing on quality teaching and learning across the school this year, with an Instructional Leader role that will further build the capacity of our classroom teachers to explicitly teach each student in guided sessions in English and mathematics. This whole school initiative began last year, with the major COVID disruption throughout the year, but our teachers found it to be very beneficial to their teaching, and ultimately in achieving better outcomes for students.
