#### **School Visits**

On Friday, 30th April, the school will have a visit from seven other primary school principals and their executive staff, to participate in a Learning Walks trial to visit many of our classrooms and talk with our students about their learning. On Tuesday, 4th May, the school will be receiving a visit from the Regional North and West Department of Education Executive Director, Mrs Lisa Muir. Mrs Muir will be coming in to see some of the great things happening in our school and discussing the plans we have started to implement as part of our strategic directions in our 4 year school improvement approach.

#### NAPLAN Year 3 and Year 5

From the 11th May until the 21st May, our school will be participating in the National Assessment Program — Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) with Year 3 and Year 5 students. NAPLAN will assess the literacy and numeracy learning of students in all Australian schools. The results of these tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement and will be able to compare their child's performance against the national minimum standard.
