Child Protection Education

Next term, our classes are going to be taught child protection education from the NSW PDHPE syllabus. It is a Department of Education responsibility to ensure that effective abuse prevention programs are implemented and that all children and young people have access to the approved child protection curriculum. Although parent permission is not required under the Education Act (1972), we encourage parents/caregivers to seek further clarification if required and to provide the teacher with any relevant information about their child that could alleviate any concerns. Balanced child protection education involves teaching and learning about three themes: Theme 1, Recognising abuse, Theme 2, Power in relationships and Theme 3, Protective strategies.

External Validation

Our school recently submitted an External Validation report, identifying 14 elements of School Excellence that our staff have rated ourselves in, on a continuum of Delivering, to Sustaining and Growing, through to Excelling. Our school staff ranked our school as Sustaining and Growing in 12 elements and Delivering in 2 elements. Yesterday, an external panel of Principals validated our school at the same levels as our self-assessment, and gave excellent feedback about our school processes across Learning, Teaching and Leading. It was a proud moment for our school, as our students, staff and parents work really hard to make this school an amazing education hub in our community. I am proud of our community in achieving this success.

Science and Engineering Challenge

30 of our Year 6 students will be participating in the Upper Hunter Science and Engineering Discovery Day in Muswellbrook on Thursday, 10th June, 2021, to be held at the Muswellbrook Indoor Sports Centre and Show Ground. The Discovery Day is a wonderful opportunity for students to become involved in hands-on practical science and engineering activities. The day is coordinated by the Rotary Club of Muswellbrook in conjunction with

the University of Newcastle and will engage students in a range of STEM based challenges. We wish our school teams all the best.



BAND WORKSHOP
