Principal's Report

Student Success

Zone Athletics Carnival – change of date

The Upper Hunter Zone Athletics Carnival is now going to the be held on Wednesday, 28th July, at Alroy Oval. The original note that was sent home included this date, as a back up, so a new note is not needed. The PSSA committee is asking that a maximum of only one parent per participant attend the carnival. Masks will need to be worn by spectators, QR codes will be available for sign in and if you are unwell, you need to stay away from the carnival. Mr Orr, Miss Lantry and Mrs Hall will be our staff members attending this event, to supervise children. Children do not need to attend for the full day but will be required to sign out with Miss Lantry if leaving early.



Staff Professional Learning/Visible Wellbeing

On Monday 12th July our staff continued their Visible Wellbeing professional learning and dove into learning about coping and how we can train ourselves and teach others to think in ways that promote resilience. Coping is the ability to bounce back from setbacks or perceived failures, and bounce forward to more optimal outcomes. Coping skills and resilience in general are key life skills—as we know that failure and disappointment are a part of daily life, so must be the ability to bounce back and heal from the negative experiences we encounter. To promote healthy coping in our school we are working on teaching some lessons about coping in the coming weeks. A great activity you might like to try at home is Silver Lining Wednesday—setting aside some time as a family to talk about any failures and challenges in the last week and draw out the positives that came from those events.

Book Week Parade

Book Week in 2021 is scheduled for the 21st-27th August, however, as this week was scheduled to be our Year 6 Canberra excursion, we have shifted our parade to Friday, 10th September. If restrictions are still in place at this time, we will hold our Book Week Parade on the back oval, the same as last year. If restrictions ease, parents will definitely be invited to attend!

Continued restrictions - a reminder for all families

Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms should be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test. Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested and self-isolate until a negative result is received.

Visitors

Non-essential visitors are not permitted in schools. Some visitors are permitted in schools based on the guidelines indicated previously.

Parents and carers must follow their school's advice regarding changes to drop off and pick up including staying in the car when dropping off and picking up children if safe to do so.

School based activities

Assemblies can be held with COVID-safe practices in place. No visitors permitted.

Singing, chanting, group repetition and choirs are permitted if conducted outside in a well-ventilated area.

Bands and ensembles are permitted in line with current health advice.

Dance or drama are permitted in line with COVID-Safe practices within classes.

Library activities are permitted in line with the Infection Control requirements.

Principal-endorsed activities for students.

Parents should:

- . maintain physical distancing by avoiding gathering outside of school gates
- . remain outside of school grounds
- . follow mask-wearing requirements and sign in using the Service NSW QR code when entering the school.











