
Kindergarten Enrolments 2023

Curriculum Support

End of Year Reports

SHPS teachers are in the middle of writing their reports for each of their students. This is a big process for all teachers who are using work samples, assessments and observations to determine how each of their students are progressing towards expected stage outcomes, that are determined by the different syllabus documents.

Kindergarten reports

Reports will describe how a child's achievement compares with syllabus standards through teacher comments. There are no achievement grades.

Year 1 to Year 6 Reports

From Year 1 to Year 6, their reports will use the following five-point achievement scale.

Achievement	Grade	Achievement Description		
Outstanding	А	The student displays an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations. Typically, the child will be working at the level of the grade above.		
High	В	The student displays above average knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.		
Sound	С	The student displays a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved within the average range of competence in the processes and skills.		
Basic	D	The student displays a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.		
Limited	E	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved very limited competence in the processes and skills.		
Effort	Grade	Effort Description		
Excellent	4	The student is consistently applying a high level of effort.		
Very Good	3	The student attempts all work consistently or at a high level.		
Satisfactory	2	The student is applying a reasonable amount of effort.		
Improvement Required	1	The level of effort is of concern.		

You may notice differences between your child's reports from year to year. Students work towards different learning outcomes depending on the grade or stage they are in. i.e. K- ES1 outcomes, Year 1 and 2 - Stage 1 outcomes, Year 3 and 4 - Stage 2 outcomes and Year 5 and 6 - Stage 3 outcomes. So, from one year to the next, you may see changes in your child's achievement levels. For example, a student in Year 2 will be working towards achieving Stage 1 outcomes and may receive a 'high' for achievement that year. The following year, the student moves into Year 3 and is working towards Stage 2 outcomes over a period of two years. For Year 3, they may receive a 'sound' for achievement. A student receiving 'sound' achievement or a 'c' grade is achieving the expected grade for their year level.

We hope this helps you understand our school reports.

Science Fun in 5G










5G have been learning about changing states of matter. They investigated the properties of solids and changed cream into butter by shaking it. They then enjoyed making and eating fairy bread using their butter!

Singleton Heights Public School
