Reading

Reading at SHPS 2023

If your family has been a part of SHPS for some time, and you have students in K-2, you will notice some changes in how we teach reading; if you're new to SHPS, jump on board, it's going to be a fantastic journey! It's an exciting time for education as we align our teaching with the new English Syllabus that is being implemented next year.

This year, staff have begun the journey by being involved in Professional Learning (PL) around the essential components of reading, working with their Stage Team and the Assistant Principal Instruction and Curriculum, as well as completing a 10 hour Phonics course online and other microlearning PL. Additional to this, K - 2 have implemented the SHPS's draft Phonics/ Spelling program.

What does reading instruction in our classes include?

Our structured reading approach will include explicit and guided teaching as well as independent practise of:

- phonological awareness and phonics
- irregular words/ high frequency words
- fluency
- vocabulary development.
- comprehension strategies

Next year, we would like to have parent workshops to help families understand what teaching reading looks like in the classrooms. Is there something in previous newsletters that you would like more information about?
