Please remember if your child receives 'sound' for achievement, this means they are displaying a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved within the average range of competence in the processes and skills for writing. This is just one work sample but teachers will use many work samples and assessments to determine the overall achievement level.
