## **Curriculum Support**

End of Year Reports - Maths

At SHPS, the reports will soon be printed. They will be sent home on Wednesday,14th December.

This week, we are sharing Stage 3 work samples that may receive a 'sound' or a 'high' achievement for a maths assessment. These Stage 3 students were posed the question: 'The answer to a problem is one and a half, what might the question be? They were asked to record a variety of questions, including word problems, number sentences and questions that involve more than one operation. They were also asked to include the four operations in their questions.

The students were assessed on their ability to:

- construct a variety of mathematical problems including word problems and questions involving more than one operation
- use fractions and/or decimals and the four operations.

### Stage 3—Sound achievement

$$1.2 - \frac{1}{2} = 1\frac{1}{2}$$

$$2.4 - 2\frac{1}{2} = 1\frac{1}{2}$$

$$3.(+\frac{1}{2} = 1\frac{1}{2})$$

$$4.3 \times \frac{1}{2} = 1\frac{1}{2}$$

$$5.4\frac{6}{3} - 2\frac{16}{2} = 4\frac{16}{2} - 2\frac{16}{6} = 3\frac{18}{6} - 2\frac{16}{6} = 1\frac{3}{6} = 1\frac{1}{2}$$

This work sample mostly shows the demonstration of single-step operations but a multi-step problem demonstrating some understanding of equivalent fractions has been used.

Three of the four operations have been used with an adequate level of competence . They are still working towards demonstrating inclusion of division problems and word problems.

### Stage 3—Outstanding Achievement

This work sample shows a student demonstrating a thorough knowledge and understanding of algebra in relation to this task. Complex questions involving more than one operation, improper fractions, brackets and large numbers have been used in mathematically creative, multi-step questions
