We are excited to announce that our school will be opening a Parent Portal/App on our Sentral communication system next week. The first component of this portal is to give you access to the 3-Way conference interview process for you and your children to meet with the classroom teachers. Families will be receiving a letter next Friday, with the website link and access codes to register for the parent portal/App. Once you register, you will receive a notification email for you to log in to the Sentral Parent Portal/App. From there, you will be able to access your child's classroom teacher interview day and select a time for your interview. It is that simple. Look out for the letter with more information next Friday.

Attendance and Explained Absences

As part of the NSW Department of Education's Attendance Policy, it is mandatory for schools to clarify unexplained absences with parents of children, within 7 days of the absence. It is vital that you call the school office to report your child's absence from school. If your child is not at school, and you have not notified the school, you will receive a text message from the school indicating your child has an unexplained absence for that day. Replying to this text message is one way of communicating the absence to the school. Shortly, with the new Parent Portal/App that we are launching, you will be able to see your child's attendance status and report any unexplained absences from there. 

Curriculum Support

Stage 3 Mathematics

Children in Stage 3 (Years 5 and 6), are working towards selecting and applying appropriate strategies for addition and subtraction with counting numbers of any size. The students are revisiting, using and applying the mental strategies learnt in previous years, such as the jump strategy, with larger numbers.

When solving problems, the students are learning to check their answers. One method, that is used by the students, is applying the inverse operation. For example:



The students are expected to solve word problems that include more than one step. An example of this is where the students are expected to use both addition and subtraction within the same problem:

Mr Green drives a truck. Last week he drove 597km, 272km and 446 km on his 3 trips. This week he drove 209 km and 265 km on his 2 trips. What was the difference in km between this week and last week's trips?

Have fun, use the addition wheel and have your child write a number in the middle. It could be a two-, three-, four-, five-digit number. Then they record number combinations between the spokes of the addition wheel, radiating out from the centre. The numbers in the spokes add up to make the total shown in the middle. See if they can check their answers by subtracting.


