Primary Strengths Carnival



Next week, on Wednesday, 25th October, the primary classes will be holding their Primary Strengths carnival.

The focus is on the Character Strengths that our students learned about in Term 3. Each event is based on a focus strength. They are Zest, Fairness, Self-Regulation, Leadership, Teamwork, Kindness Gratitude, and

Perseverance.

The Strengths carnival will be starting at 12.00, midday and finishing at 3.00pm. Students will rotate around a series of tabloid events, based on using character strengths, in their house groups. The events will be held in Area C, D and E as well as one event in the hall.



Students in 3-6 will be able to dress up in the colours of their sports houses.

Our amazing House Captains and School Captains will be leading each group, with

teachers rotating with their group. There will be 5 activities of 15 minutes duration in the middle session, 12.00 to 1.15pm and three activities of 15 minutes duration to occur after Break 2, 2.15pm to 3.00pm.

Parents are able to come into the school for the carnival to see our students having fun. You are welcome to join us to watch your children and have a picnic lunch.









Curriculum Support – Semester 2 Reports

You will receive your child's Semester Two student report at the end of this term. We wish to draw your attention to important components of our reports.

Teachers will make professional judgements, based on assessment data and teacher observation, about student achievement against the state-wide syllabus standards, particularly the syllabus outcomes and content.

Students work towards different learning outcomes depending on the year or stage they are in.

Kindergarten work towards Early Stage 1

Year 1 and 2 work towards Stage 1 outcomes

Year 3 and 4 work towards Stage 2 outcomes

Year 5 and 6 work towards Stage 3 outcomes.

Kindergarten reports describe how a student's achievement compares with syllabus standards through teachers' comments.

Achievement	Grade	Achievement Description
Working Beyond	4	The student is consistently working above expected grade level.
Achieving	3	The student is consistently working at their grade level.
Working Towards	2	The student is working towards expected grade level.
Experiencing Difficulty	1	The student is having difficulty achieving grade level tasks.

Effort Scale

You will notice a change in our effort scale this year. All stage reports will use the following three-point scale.

From Year 1 to Year 6, their reports will use the following fivepoint achievement scale.

Achievement	Grade	Achievement Description
Outstanding	Α	The student displays an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations. Typically, the child will be working at the level of the grade above.
High	В	The student displays above average knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
Sound	С	The student displays a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved within the average range of competence in the processes and skills.
Basic	D	The student displays a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
Limited	E	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved very limited competence in the processes and skills.

Please remember if your child receives a C, they are meeting grade expectations at that time of reporting. The grades given for a student are graded against the syllabus outcome expected at the time they were taught.

We described colours using our 5 senses and communicated our sentences through video, braille and sign language.








We watched each other's presentation, then talked about what we did well and what we could improve.




