Curriculum Support - New Syllabus S2 and S3

The English K–10 and Mathematics Syllabuses (2022) now includes outcomes and content for years 3–10. Teachers are in the process of becoming familiar with the new syllabus for Years 3–6 ready for its implementation in 2024.

Next Year, students in Years 3 and 4 (Stage 2) and Years 5 and 6 (Stage 3) will be taught, using focus areas, from the new syllabuses.

English

The new outcomes and content are informed by evidence and identify skills needed by all students to develop their oral language, reading and writing. They build on the foundational skills developed in K–2, deepening and enriching learning, and highlighting the role that 'understanding texts and 'creating texts' have across all areas of English.

The Syllabus Focus areas covered in English for Stage 2 and 3 are:

- Oral language and communication
- Vocabulary
- Reading fluency
- Reading comprehension
- Creating written texts
- Spelling
- Handwriting and digital transcription
- Understanding and responding to literature

Stage 3 reading fluency is included in reading comprehension.

Mathematics


The Mathematics K-10 Syllabus recognises the importance of developing an understanding of mathematical concepts, and fluency with mathematical processes, to help students interpret and solve problems. The emphasis is on students developing these concepts and skills and apply them in their own environment:

- develop essential numeracy skills and mathematical fluency as well as thinking logically, critically and creatively
- identify, describe and apply patterns and relationships
- develop their reasoning and problem-solving skills to solve routine and non-routine problems
- apply their knowledge and understanding in practical situations and make informed decisions

The Syllabus Focus areas covered in mathematics for Stage 2 (S2) and 3 (S3) are:

- S2- Representing numbers using place value
- S3 Represents Number
- Additive relations
- Multiplicative relations
- S2 -Partitioned fractions
- S3 Representing quantity fractions
- Geometric measure
- Two-dimensional spatial structure
- Three-dimensional spatial structure
- Non- spatial measure
- Data
- Chance

English and Mathematics make up about 50% of the school week – this is equivalent to at least 12 hours each week. The other subjects are spread across the remaining time (see pie chart below). The 6–10% of time noted below represents between 1.5 and 2.5 hours per week.




