Curriculum Support

Semester One Reports

The teachers are writing Semester One reports. This is a big process for all teachers.

Parents will be provided with in-depth personalised progress comments for their child in both English and mathematics. In other Key Learning Areas, comments will describe the content of units of work covered in class, identify areas of student strength, and identify areas for further development. The progress comments are based on work samples, assessments, and observations.

The subject areas that will be reported on in the half yearly report are:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science and Technology
- Human Society and Its Environment (History and Geography)
- Creative Arts
- Personal Development, Health and Physical Education

Additional to this, the reports will report:

- student's attendance
- student's attitude to learning
- an explanation of the grade scale (Years 1 to 6 only)



Kindergarten Reports

Kindergarten reports will describe how a child's achievement compares with syllabus outcomes through teacher comments.

Year 1 to Year 6 Reports

Students from Year 1 to Year 6 reports will use a grade scale. There will be more information about how grades are given in the next newsletter.

When you are looking at your child's report, use these questions to help you identify and understand what they are doing well.

- Where are your child's strengths?
- What areas were stand outs?
- Where can you celebrate?
- What areas can I support my child with?

Additional to the reports, three-way conferences are conducted at the beginning of Semester 2 between students, parent/carers and teachers.




