

Families presented the Didgeridoos to their boys and enjoyed an information session about the school's plans for the group, forging partnerships with families and the wider community and on strengthening student understanding of and respect for Aboriginal history, tradition and culture. They were treated to the beginning sounds of what we hope will be a successful group.

We thank Alex for his fine craftmanship, having made the Didgeridoos for our boys, and for working closely with us to provide opportunities for our students and families.

# **Curriculum Support - Reading at home**

Reading with your children at home will help them in all learning areas at school. Often teachers will ask you to listen to your child read at home. This is a good way to support your child's reading. You can borrow books from your school library or the local library.

#### How you can help at home

- Ensure your children see you read and write; it teaches them that reading and writing are useful skills.
- Read aloud to your children. It helps them to learn about the language of books and will encourage them to enjoy books and reading.
- Make reading enjoyable and talk about books, computer stories and information texts that you have read together.
- Be confident that your child will learn to read.
- Make a special time for reading with your children, away from any interruptions.
- Try to listen to your children read as often as you can, every day, if possible, even if only for a short time.



#### Ideas for listening to your children read

- When reading together at home try to make the time relaxed, enjoyable and positive. Vary it. Read together, read to your child and take turns or have them read to you.
- Before reading, talk about the cover, the title and any vocabulary that they may not know the meaning of.
- During reading, discuss what has been read up to that point and predict what might happen next.
- After you've finished reading with your children, talk and ask questions about the story and the characters.

#### **Useful reading tips**

When your children are reading and encounter words that are difficult for them, use the Three Ps technique ('Pause, Prompt, Praise') to support them.

#### **Pause**

When your child comes to a word they don't know, try not to jump in straight away. Wait and give your child time to work out the word

#### **Prompt**

If your children successfully work out the problem word, suggest they go back to the beginning of the sentence and re-read it (to recap meaning) before reading on.

If your child has not worked out the challenging word, prompt them with:

Early stage 1 and Stage classes -

- 'Try that again'
- 'Say the sounds by blending them together'
- 'Let's blend the sounds together'

Stage 2 and 3 – **older students** who might misread a word and continue, wait until they get to the end of the sentence before stopping them, prompt them with:

- 'Did that make sense?'
- 'Break the words into syllables and blend the syllables'

If prompts like these are not working, simply tell your children the correct word.



#### Praise


Praise your children's reading efforts and successes.

Please remember the goal of reading is always to make sense of what is read. Be supportive and enjoy the time together. Talk to your teacher for further advice if needed.

In PBL, we have been exploring the different character strengths and making posters to represent them.




























