#### **Latest News**

#### **Athletics Carnival**

#### NSW PS Surveys

Students in Years 3 to 6 will be participating in the new NSW Public Schools Survey next week. The NSW DoE runs the survey to provide schools with valuable feedback from students about their experiences at their school. The survey covers a range of topics, including student engagement, learning experiences and wellbeing at school, and is one way in which students can have a voice about their time at school. The data can support schools in their planning, reporting and excellence. This includes helping to identify strengths and areas for improvement, assess how current initiatives are going and inform future programs. An opt out note was sent through on the parent portal, if you do not wish for your child to participate in this survey. Several representatives from the Centre for Education Statistics Evaluation (CESE) will be onsite at school on Tuesday conducting research into how the surveys are conducted, as well as interviewing staff and students about their experiences with the survey.



#### **Literacy and Numeracy**

Last Monday, the school had a visit from Mr Sean Andrews, Director, Educational Leadership for the Upper Hunter. Mr Andrews visited KC, 1F and 2H to check out the school's focus on the explicit teaching of phonics and phonemic awareness. Mr Andrews said that he was genuinely impressed by the presence of explicit teaching in relation to phonics in the classrooms. More importantly, it was wonderful to witness the strong bonds and working relationships the teachers have with their students. Thank you for your dedication to creating engaging lessons.



'Our Plan for Public Education' emphasises explicit teaching and High Potential and Gifted Education. The Upper Hunter network is engaging in professional learning with Dr. Lyn Sharratt. The Upper Hunter has developed its own Implementation Plan across all 21 schools, and it is exciting that Singleton Heights PS is part of that journey for our students.

## <u>Nationally Consistent Collection of Data for Students</u> with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Funding from the Australian Government for students with disability is based on the NCCD through the student with disability loading. Students with disability who are counted in the top three levels of the NCCD (extensive, substantial and supplementary) attract the loading. Funding is based on a per-student amount at each of the three levels of additional support. The amount of the loading reflects the level of support students with disability need to participate fully in school, with higher funding for those who need higher levels of support.

Letters will be distributed to relevant families in the near future, explaining the data collection process for you.

#### **School Uniform**

Students are reminded that school uniform is to be worn. This does not include hoodies, bike pants/ tights and coloured socks. Uniforms are available from the P&C Uniform Shop.










